# **Dear Friends**

We're so excited to celebrate another school year! We remain grateful for our incredible partnerships that have made this work possible. Programs that connect students with caring adults and provide consistent support dramatically increase school engagement and completion. These one-onone relationships with trained, supportive adults help to remove barriers for students and provide resources they need to navigate school and beyond.



The needs of our students are complex, so our approach is individualized. We had the pleasure of visiting one of our Reading Corps partner schools this fall with the Lieutenant Governor and were inspired by what we heard from students, Ameri-Corps members, and school leaders. We are proud that our evidence-based tutoring programs meet students where they're at and boost both skills and confidence.

In addition to supporting students in finishing school and setting goals for the future, we trained and mobilized 200 AmeriCorps members last year. These members served in schools as tutors and

advocates, and many went on to become teachers, counselors, and nonprofit professionals. To further support transitions into meaningful careers, CYC piloted an alternative teacher residency program this past school year and will be launching a micro-credential opportunity where a year of service is combined with stackable credentials in behavioral health. We are proud of CYC's efforts to create a more robust and diverse Colorado workforce in our efforts to advance educational equity.

Thank you for all the ways you support Colorado students and the work of Colorado Youth for a Change. We hope you feel as proud as we do about the impact we are having together!

# **Program Outputs & Outcomes**

EARLY LEARNING CORPS: Early childhood education and kindergarten readiness positively
impact students throughout their school years and beyond, leading to increased school success
and likelihood of graduation. Early Learning Corps ensures that more students start kindergarten
strong by placing full-time tutors in preschool classrooms to provide evidence-based early literacy
and math tutoring during the school day.

**READING CORPS:** Research shows that not reading at grade level by 3rd grade makes children four times more likely to not complete high school, and six times more likely if they are from low-income families. Reading Corps places full-time tutors in schools to provide kindergarten through 3rd grade students with 20 minutes per day of individualized, high dosage tutoring (1:1 and in pairs) during the school day. Interventions are READ Act approved and proven to accelerate reading proficiency.

68% MET OR EXCEEDED TARGET GROWTH

MATH CORPS: Large bodies of research show that math proficiency by 8th grade is highly predictive of high school graduation and college enrollment. Yet only one in three Colorado 8th graders are at grade level in math. Math Corps places full-time tutors in schools to provide 4th-8th grade students with high dosage, small group (2-3 students) math tutoring during the school day. Interventions are evidence-based and aligned with core curriculum.

# **Program Outputs & Outcomes**

**CORPS FOR A CHANGE:** Research shows that high levels of school engagement and attendance are key indicators of graduating from high school. The Corps for a Change program places caring adults in high schools to build ongoing, trusting relationships with students who are off track to graduate. Specialists provide academic and attendance support, engage with families, connect students to resources (e.g., housing, transportation), and provide social-emotional skills and college and career guidance.

### 95% CONTINUED IN SCHOOL OR GRADUATED


**REENGAGEMENT:** Last year, nearly 10,000 Colorado students were unenrolled from school before completing a diploma. The Reengagement program provides critical reenrollment support to Denver youth, helping them to get back into school and on track to graduate. Specialists engage with families through home visits, take youth on school tours, and help them find school options that fit their unique needs.

# Highlights

### **BOOSTING EDUCATION AND EMPLOYMENT PATHWAYS FOR YOUTH AND YOUNG ADULTS**

Colorado Youth for a Change leads The Denver Opportunity Youth Initiative which is working to expand employment and education pathways to Denver Opportunity Youth – nearly 9,000 16-24 year-olds who are not in school and not working. In addition to convening partners across the City and County of Denver, the Colorado Department of Higher Education, Denver Public Schools, and local CBOs, the initiative hosted four youth forums this year. Forums talked with youth about how they define and experience belonging, wellbeing, and purpose in school, work and community. Findings will be shared with local schools and leaders.



"Belonging makes me feel welcome. Before I came here, I was lost in the sauce. This (program) gave me a purpose. It gave me a sense of purpose when someone wanted to hire me. That feels good."

### THIRD PARTY EVALUATION OF READING CORPS SHOWS POSITIVE RESULTS

A 2022-2023 evaluation of Reading Corps in Colorado revealed an average student growth equivalent to several months of additional instruction when receiving interventions. Student growth was even more significant among English-language learners. Reading Corps not only yields positive educational outcomes but is also cost-effective. Cost-benefit analyses show that the program provides a strong return on investment, exceeding \$5 for every \$1 invested, primarily due to improved educational results and higher high school graduation rates.

### CYC AMERICORPS MEMBER FEATURED IN TEEN VOGUE

Our own Nelly Grosso was featured in Teen Vogue this year, after serving for two years with Colorado Youth for a Change. Nelly was interviewed by a variety of publications to promote CYC's new Youth Mental Health Corps in partnership with AmeriCorps, the Schultz Family Foundation, and Pinterest. Here's a quote when asked about supporting mostly immigrant students:



"The biggest barrier that they have right now is trying to navigate an entire country and an entire education system, culture, way of thinking all while also learning English. And a lot of my students feel the pressure to succeed, which has really impacted their mental health. At the end of the day, it makes sense, because they're coming from really tough backgrounds."
